The letter to the Hebrews addresses this. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith". (Hebrews 12:1-2a)



- 1. The Finance Committee Meeting was called to order on August 12th, 2025, at 11 AM.
 - Prayer was led by Pastor Lem.
- 2. Review of previous minutes:
 - July 8th, 2025, minutes were reviewed and accepted as printed.
- 3. Treasurer's Report -Leann provided copies of church financial reports.
 - July 2025: Income: \$9,963.68 Expenses: \$10,358.07 Net: -394.39
 - There was a quarterly tax payment of \$418 that negatively affected the balance this month.
 - YTD: Income: \$71,013.82. Expenses: \$80,029.12 Net: -\$9,015.30
 - All bills and Ministry Shares are paid.
 - There is a Congregational Update scheduled for near the end of August regarding finances. The same information will be in the newsletter.
 - Discussion about what a savings occurs because Pastor Lem uses his retirement health care, not the church sponsored health care. Edmore Faith saves over \$20,000 annually due to this blessing.
 - Monthly Income, Expenses, and Year-to-Date Balance will be printed in the bulletin once a month to keep the church family more informed.
 - Discussion about trying to have a thorough budget review this year when setting the 2026 budget having more time and really looking at what was spent to inform decisions for 2026.

Financial Update

Dear Church Family and Friends,

It has been about 5 months since we last presented a financial update.

Our church continues to have many blessings! Perhaps most church family members are unaware of what a tremendous blessing Pastor Lem and Colleen are. We all certainly benefit from their ministry and their involvement in numerous church activities. In addition to their ministry, **Pastor Lem uses his retirement health insurance, which means Edmore Faith saves over \$20,000 annually** by not having to provide health insurance. Wow! *Pastor Lem is also listed as a half-time pastor, but we all know we see him far more than that. Thank you, Pastor Lem and Colleen!

We have a wonderful church family who care deeply about each other, about our surrounding communities, as well as those farther away that we help through our mission work. Our church is full of joy—coffee hour finds folks chatting and laughing. We have willing workers keeping our church and parsonage in the best shape possible. Sunday worship is enjoyed by all. We see a few new faces joining us for worship. We are happy to share our wonderful church home with groups needing a spot—AA and Euchre groups meet regularly, as well as our monthly Friends and Fellowship. The Men's bimonthly Bible Study and monthly Grief Group (including non-church family members) are great additions to church life!

The Finance Committee continues to monitor finances and suggest adjustments if/when needed to be the best stewards of our funds. It was hoped that the return to nicer weather would have a positive impact on our financial situation, but that has not been the case. As of August 2025, we are down approximately \$9,015. This is obviously an area of concern that needs to be shared with you.

Please keep our church in your prayers always, but especially at this time. Despite this financial challenge, the business of the church continues—bills to pay, repairs to the church and parsonage as needed to keep them in good condition, as well as unexpected costs that can pop up at any time.

Please do continue your faithful giving. Edmore Faith is blessed by so many giving at the maximum for their life situation---so thank you! Your giving allows our church to continue to be the beacon of hope and help for the community for which it is so well known.

Please prayerfully consider ideas for enhancing the financial health of Edmore Faith.

One Option to consider:

Consider increasing your giving by 10%. Often this is such a slight increase, it may not always feel different, BUT everyone's 10% increase in total could make a difference for Edmore Faith. If the weekly offering for Edmore Faith was, \$1,900, a 10% increase on the total offering would change that amount to \$2,090. If a church family member currently gives \$10 weekly, a 10% increase would mean that would change to \$11. A chart is provided to show 10% and 20% increases for a variety of giving amounts.


A future dessert auction is being considered. This is always a fun fellowship time and provides some much-needed funds as well.

* FYI: A number of people have asked about Pastor Lem's half-time pastor status mentioned in the Congregational Update. We are extremely blessed that Pastor Lem is listed as a half-time pastor, and his benefits are related to that half-time status. However, we all know that Pastor Lem works far more than half the time. As also mentioned, Pastor Lem and Colleen are using Pastor Lem's retirement health insurance—another great savings for Edmore Faith Church. Both the half-time status and the insurance situation are extraordinary benefits for Edmore Faith Church! We are grateful!

Becky - Potato Tent Event

- Our first elephant ear rolling session was yesterday, Monday, July 28.
- August 6th at 10:00 AM, there will be a Potato Tent meeting.
- Leonard picked up oil for the elephant ears.

United Women In Faith

Had a nice meeting for July. It was a potluck.

- We will need to elect officers again.
- The district meeting will be in October in Alma, and people will need to sign up on the sheet on the bulletin board. Jean is attending.

Trustees

- Waiting until it cools off a little before we move forward with some projects.
- They believe they figured out the blinking light issue.
- Working on getting the lights changed on the cross.
- The gutter is cracked, got an estimate from Kieff's for the price of \$2650.00. This includes them cleaning the gutters, repairing them, and putting on gutter guards. The trustees made a motion and passed it.
- The center patio has a lot of weeds and grass. It was discussed to have someone clean it out and put cement in the area. This will prevent rain from seeping into the sanctuary during a heavy rain. The funds for this project will come from the Lee Robert Fund.
- Leonard got rid of the heavy green chairs.

Missions

- Linda brought some brochures for a camp that the Women In Faith donated \$100 to for Pat Loveless' granddaughter to go to camp.
- Discussion on whether we want to change direction on the camp that we support. This camp has day camps, week-long camps, and day camps for special needs.
- Finance has discussed the camp and how they want to proceed with it. They have also decided that the camper will need to be active in our church if we are going to support them.

SPRC

- The charge conference will be coming up. There is a webinar that will be covering forms that will be slightly different from previous years.
- There was discussion about Sunday School and Nursery staffing. By law, we are supposed to have 2 people in each room. Anyone who helps out in those rooms needs to have a background screening. Calley will make a sign-up sheet for the screenings. This will be passed along during the service.
- We discussed reconfiguring the setup of the 2 rooms so they are open to each other ,creating the need for only 2 adults instead of 4 with the following ideas and thoughts:

SPRC (continued)

- Putting a door or window in between the nursery and the Sunday school room. The cost of putting in a door would be very high. We would have to re-route the heat and electric, and there was a question about whether it is a supporting wall.
- Change the library to the Sunday school room. By moving the half door between the current library and the nursery. (Leonard checked, and the doors are not interchangeable.)
- Putting a window in the door between the current library and the nursery.
- Switch the counting room and the nursery. (But, there has been a lot of work done on the current nursery, so it would be a shame not to use it as the nursery anymore.) There is no door between the counting room and the Sunday school room.
- Jane will speak to Priscilla about the possible changes.
- Linda mentioned that she needs a sign-up sheet for the people who work with the Friends and Fellowship group for background screenings.
- It has been difficult getting help for the nursery. When they are asked to help, they respond, "Not today".
- Pastor Lem mentioned that we set up a list of people and rotate people through to work in the nursery.
- The responsibility of the second person is to just sit and be a second set of eyes. There is a speaker in the nursery, so you can still hear the service.

Education

• The Adult Sunday school class is up to 6 regular attendees. Just finished I & II Peter and now moving onto I John. Jean is looking at another possible study that she thinks would be interesting about chocolate.

Finance

- They discussed speaking to the congregation again. We will add our financial status to the newsletter as well.
- We will start putting a financial update in the bulletin again.

Worship

- Jean was thinking we could have a hat Sunday.
- Thinking about doing a hymn sing, possibly in October. Fletcher is ready and willing to do it again. He really enjoys playing for them.

Calley-Secretary

- Handed out Charge conference paperwork. Leonard would like last year's copies to have something to go by.
- Calley would like to use last year's order forms for the potato tent and print the new items on them to save paper. But the costs have changed, and we have added a few items, so we will need to print new ones.

Pastor

- Pastor Lem will be applying to be an associate member, which gives him a permanent license to
 preach. He will be doing a lot of paperwork to move forward with this, and he needs to do a
 psychological exam online. Being an Associate Member will allow him to do sacraments and the like
 outside the parish as needed. (Side Note from Pastor Lem: "This doesn't mean I will be going away".)
- The men's group is going well. We keep inviting others.
- The Pierson church has a community garden, and they are looking for recipes for vegetables that would be included in the garden. They are looking for some basic instructions to use the vegetables. This is included in the August Newsletter.
- Discussion about using our land to start one here.

New Business

• A church in Six Lakes has recently closed. Linda Helms came here from that church last Sunday. We could reach out to their congregation and invite them to attend here.

Around the Table

• Joan Rasmussen reached out to Jane regarding the Texas flood situation. She thinks it would be nice for our church to mention the Texas flood relief effort and how we can donate to it. Joan's daughter works with Texans on Mission (they have a 501C3), and they immediately go to flood areas. We typically donate to UMCOR, and we will mention it during church. Calley will look into information to donate to UMCOR so that it goes to the Texas Flood relief effort.
