

The movie is available on Amazon Prime and has a rating of five out of five. It is a heartfelt story that you won't want to miss.





Finance

- August Income: \$10,136.66 Expenses \$9,856.12 In the black for August \$280.54 YTD: \$8,734.76
- Ministry shares were decreased by 4.18% from the district. They will be \$11,144.00 which is a savings of \$486.00
- It was decided after a couple of months of discussion to put \$25,000.00 into a 1 year CD.

- Youth for Christ: What is the best way we can support them? We can support them not only financially but volunteering. It would be a good opportunity for us to help them when we can and it could help us in the process. We need to think about ways to help and ways they could possibly help us.
- Audit: We have not done one this year, we are looking into doing one next year for a 2 year audit. We are trying to find someone to do it for us.
- A motion was brought forward to send \$1000.00 from the John Anderson Fund to Youth for Christ. Janella Hicks made the motion, it was seconded by Jane Beach. All were in favor and the motion carries.

• We will be having a meeting sometime in the near future. There have been funds that have come in, the group needs to meet and discuss where the money will be going.

• They just had a meeting and they are working on songs that agree with everyone, though it is difficult to suit everyone.


Calley-Secretary

United Women In Faith

Thirteen ladies attended this meeting, which was called to order by Secretary Jean due to the absence of President Janella and Vice President Pat K. After a prayer was given, Jean read the Bible Verse selected for today from 1 John 3:18: "Let us not love with words and speech, but with actions and in truth." Then the group recited the Mission Statement.

The secretary's minutes from the meeting of September 2, 2025, were read by Jean and approved.

Georgia gave the treasurer's report. She started by saying that Kathy would be helping her. Payments have been made to UMCOR, our pledge for 2025, and for attendance at the October 4th District meeting, which will be paid back by the attendees. Tina received \$500 from Steve Naru for his sister's celebration luncheon. Our total before today's offering is \$1416.37. Georgia read a thank-you note from Steve Naru.

The Potato Tent brought in \$6561. This will be discussed at the next Church Council meeting, and our group will probably receive 10% of the profit.

Seven women attended the Annual District Celebration at Alma UMC on October 4th. The Keynote Speaker was Rev. Dr. April Gutierrez. Our group received a certificate for obtaining the FAITH level for our unit objectives. Kathy Bongard and Jean Croll received certificates for completing the first level in the reading program. This means that they each read 5 books from the 2024 reading list. The certificates are posted on the bulletin board in the hallway. There is a state campaign called Gardens of Hope, which was presented to this group. The district would like each unit to give a hope gift of \$350 to support Engage partners in Haiti. A discussion was held about what our church mission group contributes to Haiti. Linda will gather the numbers to share with Jean for our discussion in November.

Jean reminded the group of upcoming funeral/celebration lunches: October 11th for Stevie, October 25th for Dick, and November 15th for Hazel's brother. Discussion held. October 26 is a potluck for Pastor Appreciation. The meat will be provided.

A discussion was held as to what we should do with our money. Kathy moved that we spend \$1000 on special needs. 2nd by Georgia. Motion passed. Becky moved that we give Hazel \$300 towards clothing for the school children, seconded by Fran, motion carried. Linda said that Missions may add to Hazel's amount. Hazel agreed to handle this project for another year. Further motions were made to give \$200 to Ritchie's project, \$100 to Have Mercy, and \$100 to RAVE. Motions carried. The remaining \$300 will be discussed during the next meeting. Everyone is to think about this.

Cards to be sent to the Klunder family, Sally, and Nancy Rogers. Jean gave the program reading from the book "50 Women Every Christian Should Know." She read about Florence Nightingale. This book can be borrowed from Kathy for further programs.

Next month, Kathy will be the hostess (substitution for Dolores) and Fran will do the program.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

1. The Finance Committee Meeting was called to order on October 14th, 2025, at 11 AM.

- Prayer was led by Pastor Lem.
- Jane Beach shared a devotion on JOY, and Georgia will do devotions for the November meeting—see explanatory note below in minutes.

2. Review of previous minutes:

- September 12th, 2025, minutes were reviewed and accepted as read/printed. Motion to accept Georgia, 2nd Jane. Passed by group vote.
- Discussion occurred regarding adding a devotion at the beginning of the meeting and prayer requests at the end. All felt this was a good idea.
- Jane did a devotion today, and Georgia will do one for the November meeting.

3. Treasurer's Report

- Pastor Lem started the Treasurer's report by discussing a hypothetical situation, helping to understand that finances are important, but not the overall focus and mission of the church. Loving God and others should continue to be the ultimate focus.
- Leann provided copies of the church's financial reports.
 - September 2025: Income: \$18,097.18; Expenses: \$11,369.18 Net: +\$6727.98 —this reporting includes income from the Potato Event, which largely created the increase in net income.
 - YTD: Income: \$98,219.67; Expenses: 101,254.42 \$Net: -\$3,034.75. The negative year-to-date balance is declining but remains a concern.
 - Discussion about trying to have a thorough budget review this year when setting the 2026 budget—having more time for committees to really look at what was spent to inform decisions for 2026.
 - Ministry shares for 2026 will be decreased by 4.18%, saving \$486. The new amount will be \$11,144 for the year.
 - Per last month's financial discussion and church council action, \$25,000 was put into a 1-year
 CD at MPECU. The CD has earned \$59.38 since its recent inception.
 - At November's meeting, it will be decided what needs to be dispersed from the Potato Event money. We always do 10% to Missions and are wondering if the 10% for kitchen/supplies needs to be set aside as per usual, or can be directed to offset our negative YTD balance.



o In addition to donating \$1,000 out of John Anderson # 2 for Youth For Christ (a fund for young people carrying out Christian work in the world), a discussion occurred about other ways to partner with YFC to help them, Edmore Faith and the Community—some discussion about holding a community event at their building downtown—the Garage. Ideas still being considered. Will work with Missions on this as well.

4. Old Business

- Audit was again discussed. P Lem asked New Life to have their person call us if interested. Lisa will reach out to Dean Jensen, retired CPA, to see if he has any interest in doing this—no info on this at this time. At this point, we are considering a 2-year audit sometime in mid-2026.
- 5. New Business None currently
- 6. Around The Table
 - Leann was seeking clarification about the 'Memorial' money for the kitchen currently held at the Michigan Area Loan Fund. At this point, it appears that it was money set aside for kitchen projects —not from a family memorial. As such, it can be released to the Memorial Committee to use for kitchen updates.
 - No other input from committee members that wasn't discussed earlier in the meeting.
- 7. Next meeting November 11th, 11 AM
- 8. Meeting closed with prayer by Pastor Lem for various individuals—some from church concerns and some brought up at this meeting.
